Camp Profile

The Academic Fun & Fitness Camp serves the unique needs of children with learning disabilities: ADHD, learning disabilities, Asperger's, PDD, dyslexia, or those who struggle in school. Academic and recreational activities build skills and confidence. Instructors are assigned to maintain 5:1 camper to staff ratio.

Group 1	Ages 6 – 8 years
Group 2	Ages 9 – 12 years
Group 3	Teens

PM Sessions

Campers will be placed in multi-aged groups: The Indians, The Browns and The Cavaliers. This type of grouping promotes developmentally appropriate fun through sports, games and social skills. Individual progress will be addressed as campers are encouraged to work together to solve problems using group dynamics. Campers will interact with our well trained counselors as they make friends across age groups. Each camper will feel more confident, comfortable and adept in problem solving by working together.

Instruction and Assessment

Our professionally trained staff understands the needs of children with learning differences. Staff members provide individual attention and support in a nurturing and structured environment. Each child is evaluated to determine academic needs. Parents receive a summary of the interview and test results as well as a progress report at the end of the camp.

Camp Registration and Fees

Applicants are screened by the camp director who reviews the current IEP, ETR, school reports, and interviews or observations to determine if this camp meets their needs. Full payment is due by May 15, 2017. A limited number of partial scholarships are available. Families may use funds from the Autism and Jon Peterson Scholarships, local school district, DD, and other sources.

Three one-hour mini courses and activities focusing on group building, leadership development, social skills and recreation.

Morning Session

Richards Learning Systems®: This multi-sensory, phonics-based approach to language arts helps children who struggle with word attack, comprehension, writing and spelling skills.

Real Life Math: Based on age level and needs, math topics may include addition, subtraction, place value, multiplication, division, fractions, decimals, percentages, money, and problem-solving strategies.

Afternoon Session

Various activities provide opportunities for creativity and exploration while developing social skills and self confidence. New activities are added each year to keep camp fun and interesting for returning campers.

Theater Arts: Campers participate in an original play. Parents receive a video copy of the production.

Hands-On Science: "Future scientists" work with a variety of science experiences exploring subjects like nature, flight, and rockets.

Music Therapy: Engage campers in multi-sensory musical learning with a trained music therapist.

Visual Arts: Campers explore a variety of methods to create art, assisted by a trained art therapist.

Sports: Our sports director leads a variety of non-competitive sports – including tennis and baseball.

Martial Arts: Weekly class with a trained instructor.
